



## CALL FOR APPLICATION

**The University of Pécs calls for applications for participating in the Pannónia Scholarship Program Student Mobility for Learning Programme for the spring semester of the 2025/2026 academic year.**

### **The object of the call for applications:**

Long-term student mobilities for study purposes are student mobilities based on inter-institutional agreements, implemented with the purpose of obtaining credits, and directed to specific target countries, the duration of which is a minimum of 2 months and a maximum of 5 months.

Student mobilities for academic purposes can be implemented in any study area and cycle, including doctoral training. The study period abroad must be part of the student's study program aimed at obtaining a diploma within any study cycle, and the sending institutions must accept it and fully comply with the curriculum structure in terms of the time of student mobility in a proportional manner. **The credit acquisition and recognition process must be recorded in the mobility agreement of the student participating in the mobility.**

Within the Pannónia Scholarship Programme, students studying abroad also enroll at home, establish active student status, pay any tuition fees at their home institution, and receive their regular scholarship for the duration of their stay abroad.

Duration of study mobility abroad: **minimum 2 months - maximum 5 months (60-150 days)**

**Period of study mobility: December 26, 2025 – July 25, 2026**

Currency of the scholarship: **HUF**

Scholarship disbursement: **90% pre-financing – 10% post-financing**

### **Pannónia Scholarship Program students studying abroad:**

- spend 2-5 months abroad (depending on the year they are in and the partner institution).
- do not pay tuition fee at the receiving institution; however, may be obliged to pay registration/administration fee (mainly at German universities).
- **enroll at the home university, establish an active student status, pay any applicable tuition fees to their home university**, and receive their grants for the period of studying abroad.
- **do not obtain their degree before ending the mobility.**
- 100% credit recognition (credits earned abroad are 100% accepted by PTE) – **you have to complete at least 3 major related courses or 15 major related ECTS at the host institution!**
- The program/PTE/Sending Faculty guarantees recognition of the credits earned abroad for the students: the activity carried out during the student's study mobility must be accepted by the sending institution and must fully comply with the curriculum structure, thus avoiding possible slippage, which is one of the biggest deterrent among students.

- **The conclusion of the Support Agreement is only possible if there is a Learning Agreement signed by all three parties.** Completion and compliance with the courses agreed in the Learning Agreement is binding for both the student and the institutions.

**We would like to draw your attention to the fact that mobility cannot be started without a signed and faculty-approved Learning Agreement, the decision of the Faculty International Committee, and the signed grant agreement.** The university will not transfer funds after the start date of the mobility if the above-mentioned conditions are not met.

#### Who can apply?

##### General participation conditions:

- the student is pursuing studies aimed at obtaining a diploma (Bachelor, Master, Undivided, PhD) at the institution.
- the student has **1 completed active semester** at the time of application.

- in the semester in which the mobility takes place, **the student has an active student status at PTE; and do not obtain their degree before the end of the mobility period.**
- the student has a high communication level of English and/or language competences corresponding to the native language of the destination country (minimum B2 but recommended C1).
- students with Stipendium Hungaricum scholarship **cannot apply for Pannónia grant.**
- the student is allowed to participate in a study mobility period for a maximum of 12 months per academic cycle, regardless of the number or type of mobility activities.
- meet the application requirements announced by the given faculty.

**We cannot support your mobility in case you are in the semester of your graduation!**

**Documents to be submitted by the applicants:**

- Professional CV
- Motivational Letter (at least 1500 characters, including your name and major)
- Official Transcript of Records of the 2 previous semesters issued by the Registrar's Office – 1 semester in case of a first-year student
- Language certificate(s)
- Recommendation Letter (one from an assistant lecturer is not acceptable)
- Certificate of professional or public activities (optional)

**Grants for the academic year 2025/2026:**

The amount of the grant depends on the length of the study period (number of days) and on the host country.

*The amount of the scholarship does not necessarily cover all costs incurred during the stay abroad, these must be covered from other sources.*

**Deadline and method of submitting the application:**

**Application deadline at the Faculty: October 8, 2025, at 14:00 p.m. in Neptun.**

### Evaluation of submitted applications:

The submitted applications will be evaluated by the professional committee set up by the faculty, the Faculty External Affairs Committee, by the beginning of November of 2025.

*Please note that incomplete applications, applications that do not meet the conditions, or applications arriving after the deadline will not be accepted!*

### Point System:

A maximum of 100 points can be awarded for the applications.

#### 1. Academic Achievement: **maximum 30 points**

The grade point average of the two semesters preceding the application submission. (If the student has only completed one semester at the time of the submission, they can provide the proof of completing the second semester before traveling, by submitting the transcript for that semester. In this case, the score will be calculated by doubling the result of the first semester.)

Grading based on the student's GPA:

GPA Range		Points
5,00 -	4,50	30 points
4,49 -	4,00	20 points
3,99 -	3,50	10 points

The student must have a minimum GPA of 3.5 to apply for the scholarship.

If the student's GPA is below 3.5, the BTK Erasmus Committee may decide to approve the application based on the recommendation letter from the department (the result can be scored up to 5 points).



2. Language Exam: **maximum 30 points**

Knowledge of the language of the host country is mandatory.

If the student only has a B2 type C language exam and is not enrolled in a foreign language program or department, they must attend an additional language assessment. (The language test will be conducted with the involvement of university professors who teach in the relevant language.)

State-recognized advanced type C language exam 25 points.

State-recognized intermediate type C language exam 20 points.

Language exam in a second language (at least intermediate type C language exam) 5 points

3. Academic Activity: **maximum 30 points**

Republic scholarship: 8 points

OTDK/ TDK placement, award: 6 points

Scientific Students' Associations/ Advanced Studies Activity: 4 points

Academic publications: 4 points (total)

Presentation at an academic professional conference: 4 points

Participation in an academic competition: 4 points

4. Public life and other Student Activities: **maximum 10 points**

Work in university, city or national press: 3 points

Active participation in Student Government (HÖK): 3 points

Supporting foreign students as an Erasmus „Buddy”: 2 points

Other Erasmus promotional activities (departmental, faculty): 2 points

(If the students engage in other academic, public life, or student circle activities, the Pannónia Committee has the right to award additional points.)

**A minimum of 40 points is required for a successful application!**
