

CALL FOR APPLICATIONS

The University of Pécs calls for applications for participation in the Pannónia Scholarship Program Student Mobility for Traineeship after Graduation for autumn semester of the academic year of 2026/2027

The object of the call for applications:

The traineeship is a period spent at an enterprise or organization in another program country, with a duration of a minimum of 2 and a maximum of 4 months. Its aim is to assist in acquiring the skills necessary for the labour market and to understand the economic and social culture of the host country. The hosting enterprise can be active in the labour market or in the fields of education, training, or youth, with the exception of National Offices and EU agencies.

Under the Pannónia Scholarship Program, successful applicants have the opportunity to undertake professional traineeships at universities, professional organizations, and non-profit organizations in the program country. For post-graduate professional traineeships, no acceptance is required.

Students participating in traineeships abroad under the Pannónia Scholarship Program establish an active student status during the application period and begin their professional traineeship after obtaining their degree.

Duration of traineeship: min. 2 months (63 days) – max. 4 months (120 days)

Period of traineeship: 13 July 2026 – 11 December 2026.

Currency of the scholarship: HUF

Scholarship financing: 80% pre-financing, 20% post-financing (after submission of mandatory documentation).

Under the Pannónia Scholarship Program, students studying abroad:

- spend 2-4 months abroad (min. 63 days)
- hold an active student status during the application period
- **do not have student status during the mobility**
- **The conclusion of the Support Agreement is only possible if there is a Learning Agreement signed by all three parties.** Completion and compliance with the courses

agreed upon in the Learning Agreement are binding for both the student and the institutions.

Who can apply?

General participation conditions:

- the student is pursuing studies aimed at obtaining a diploma (Bachelor, Master, Undivided, PhD) at the institution at the time of application.
- the student has a high level of communication in English and/or language competencies corresponding to the native language of the destination country (minimum B2 but recommended C1).
- the student is allowed to participate in a study mobility period for a maximum of 12 months per academic cycle, regardless of the number or type of mobility activities.
- students who have already participated in Erasmus+ study or professional internship mobilities are also eligible to apply.
- the student must meet the application requirements announced by the given faculty.

Documents to be submitted:

- Motivation Letter (approximately 1500 characters, including your name and major)
- Professional CV
- Language certificate(s)
- Official Transcript of records (2 previous semesters) issued by the Registrar's Office
- Language Certificate(s)
- Certificate of professional or public activities (optional)
- Recommendation Letter (one from an assistant lecturer is not acceptable)
- Acceptance letter (signed and stamped, including the exact dates and tasks)

! After the application deadline, a motivational interview will take place!

The final scholarships are calculated on a daily basis based on the submitted Traineeship Agreement.

The equal opportunity support is provided on the basis of a separate application.

The announcement and evaluation of the application and the conclusion of contracts are institutional competences.

We would like to draw the attention of applying students to the fact that the scholarship does not cover all the costs incurred during the mobility; it must be supplemented from other sources!

Deadline and method of submitting the application:

Application deadline: 12 March 2026 - 3:00 PM, on Neptun. Further information about the application will be provided by the faculty coordinator!

We advise you to prepare all the needed documentation beforehand.

Please note that incomplete applications, applications that do not meet the conditions, or applications arriving after the deadline will not be accepted!

Submission of the application is possible subject to the availability of funds. For this type of mobility, neither an extension of the duration nor a postponement is possible.

Evaluation of submitted applications:

The applications will be evaluated by the professional committee established by the faculty, the Faculty External Affairs Committee, by the beginning of April 2026.

Point System:

A maximum of 100 points can be awarded for the applications.

1. Academic Achievement: maximum 30 points

The grade point average of the two semesters preceding the application submission. (If the student has only completed one semester at the time of the submission, they can provide the proof of completing the second semester before traveling, by submitting the transcript for that semester. In this case, the score will be calculated by doubling the result of the first semester.)

Grading based on the student's GPA:

GPA Range		Points
5,00 -	4,50	30 points
4,49 -	4,00	20 points
3,99 -	3,50	10 points

The student must have a minimum GPA of 3.5 to apply for the scholarship.

If the student's GPA is below 3.5, the BTK Erasmus Committee may decide to approve the application based on the recommendation letter from the department (the result can be scored up to 5 points).

2. Language Exam: **maximum 30 points**

Knowledge of the language of the host country is mandatory.

If the student only has a B2 type C language exam and is not enrolled in a foreign language program or department, they must attend an additional language assessment. (The language test will be conducted with the involvement of university professors who teach in the relevant language.)

State-recognized advanced type C language exam	25 points.
State-recognized intermediate type C language exam	20 points.
Language exam in a second language (at least intermediate type C exam)	5 points

3. Academic Activity: **maximum 30 points**

Republic scholarship:	8 points
OTDK/ TDK placement, award:	6 points
Scientific Students' Associations/ Advanced Studies Activity:	4 points
Academic publications:	4 points
Presentation at an academic professional conference:	4 points
Participation in an academic competition:	4 points

4. Public life and other Student Activities: **maximum 10 points**

Work in university, city or national press:	3 points
Active participation in Student Government (HÖK):	3 points
Supporting foreign students as an Erasmus „Buddy”:	2 points
Other Erasmus promotional activities (departmental, faculty):	2 points

(If the students engage in other academic, public life, or student circle activities, the Pannónia Committee has the right to award additional points.)

A minimum of 40 points is required for a successful application!
