Dear Student of the International Relations MA training programme,

In the case of certain training programmes, the curriculum prescribes a 30-credit curriculum block, which in the **International Relations MA** training programme, called a *Specialization module*.

The **Specialization module/Minor** are essentially an in-department training program where the student can deepen their studies in a given topic within a pre-determined credit value. The module selection procedure, like the course registration, takes place in Neptun. After logging in choose the *Administration* menu, then *Module selection*.

**International Relations MA** students can choose between the following *Specialization modules* or *Minors*:

- European Studies [EUTRANMA171801] specialization 50 credits
- Regional and Civilization Studies [RECRANMA171801] specializations 50 credits

Some modules may have a special entry requirement or an application interview.

We suspect this might be a bit confusing, but we'll try to outline the structure of the curriculum for you, and we'll also attach the curriculum of your training programme itself.

- **Core subjects** (81 credits) Foundation subjects that everyone, regardless of specialisation, should complete.
- **Specialization module** (30 credits) You must currently choose one of the above listed Specialization modules. This will be the main focus of your studies.
- Electives (9 credits) You need to complete a total of 10 credits of electives throughout your studies. Any course you complete that is not compulsory in your curriculum is counted as an elective.

## Application period: 15 - 26 April 2023.

Admission is decided by the departments.
