



Dear Student of the Liberal Arts BA,

In the case of certain training programmes, the curriculum prescribes a so-called **elective Specialization module** for students. In the previous semester in **Liberal Arts, BA** you were already required to choose a so-called **professional module (Major)**, which is an 80-credit curriculum block. This semester you will need to choose the **Specialization module (Minor)** too.

Both the **Specialization module** and the **Study track** is essentially an in-department training program where the student can deepen their studies in a given topic within a pre-determined credit value. The specialization procedure, like the course registration, takes place in Neptun. After logging in choose the menu *Administration*, then *Module selection*.

For **Liberal Arts, BA** you can choose between the following *Minors*:

- **Philosophy** – 80 credits
- **Film Theory and History** – 80 credits
- **Classics** – 80 credits
- **Art History** – 80 credits

We suspect this might be a bit confusing, but we'll try to outline the structure of the curriculum for you, and we'll also attach the curriculum itself.

- **Core subjects** (40 credits) – Foundation subjects that everyone, regardless of specialisation, should complete.
- **Major (80 credits)** – You already chose one previously. This is the main focus of your studies.
- **Minor (50 credits)** – You must currently choose one of the above listed Specialization modules.
- **Electives** (10 credits) - You need to complete a total of 10 credits of electives throughout your studies. Any course you complete that is not compulsory in your curriculum is counted as an elective.



Some modules may have a special entry requirement or an application interview.
