



Dear Student of the Slavonic Studies (Russian) BA training programme,

In the case of certain training programmes, the curriculum prescribes a 50-credit curriculum block, which in the **Slavonic Studies (Russian) BA** training programme can be either a **Specialization module** **OR** a **Minor**.

The **Specialization module/Minor** are essentially an in-department training program where the student can deepen their studies in a given topic within a pre-determined credit value. The module selection procedure, like the course registration, takes place in Neptun. After logging in choose the **Administration** menu, then **Module selection**.

**Slavonic Studies BA** students can choose between the following *Specialization modules* or *Minors*:

- **Cultural Studies (Специализация «Основы культурологических знаний»)** [KULTISANBO222302] specialization – 50 credits
- **English and American Studies** [ANGMANBA232401] **minor** – 50 credits
- **Germanic Studies (German)** [GNEMANBN232401] **minor** – 50 credits
- **Germanic Studies (German as Ethnic Minority)** [GNNMANBN232401] **minor** – 50 credits
- **Pedagogy** [PEDMANBA232401] **minor** – 50 credits
- **Archeology** [REGMANBA232401] **minor** – 50 credits
- **Liberal Arts (Film Theory and History)** [SFTMANBA232401] **minor** – 50 credits
- **Liberal Arts (Philosophy)** [SFLMANBA232401] **minor** – 50 credits
- **Liberal Arts (Classics)** [SCLMANBA232401] **minor** – 50 credits
- **Liberal Arts (Art History)** [SMUMANBA232401] **minor** – 50 credits
- **Slavonic Studies (Russian)** [SLOMANBO232401] **minor** – 50 credits
- **Social Work** [SZMMANBA232401] **minor** – 50 credits
- **Romance Philology and Cultures (French)** [UFRMANBF232401] **minor** – 50 credits

We suspect this might be a bit confusing, but we'll try to outline the structure of the curriculum for you, and we'll also attach the curriculum of your training programme itself.

- **Core subjects** (120 credits) – Foundation subjects that everyone, regardless of specialisation, should complete.
- **Specialization or Minor module** (50 credits) – You must currently choose one of the above listed Specialization modules. This will be the main focus of your studies.
- **Electives** (10 credits) - You need to complete a total of 10 credits of electives throughout your studies. Any course you complete that is not compulsory in your curriculum is counted as an elective.

**Application period: 15 - 26 April 2023.**

Admission is decided by the departments.
